## FAST FACTS

- Houston has a Taxpayer Burden of \$12,100, which is each taxpayer's share of the city's debt.
- Houston taxpayers also pay taxes to the county and other underlying government units. If these debts are included, each taxpayer's burden is \$12,530.
- When state debt is added to city debt, each taxpayer has a burden of \$21,130.
